Russia and Ukraine Relations (RUUK) Section

TITLE: VNC

#### 1. SUMMARY

The VNC, working under the general guidance of the Section Head, and in close coordination with the current desk officers for Russia and Ukraine, will be responsible for contributing to the Section's work on advancing NATO's analytical understanding of Russia and shaping the Alliance's Russia policy.

The main functions of the VNC will include: drafting analytical briefs on specific issues related to Russia's domestic developments, as well as foreign policy, assisting in drafting a wide range of documents for use by the Secretary General, Deputy Secretary General, PASP management and other senior NATO officials; assisting in drafting documents for public use, working with colleagues in Press and PDD, providing briefings on NATO-Russia related issues to visiting groups, policy makers and think-thanks, representing the PASP Division within and outside NATO. He/she will liaise with other NATO Divisions, and representatives of delegations, as appropriate. He/she will also provide back up for relevant work on Ukraine, in the framework of the NATO-Ukraine Commission (NUC), and in close cooperation with the other RUUK officers. He/she may also be asked to assist on similar tasks related to other countries in Eastern Europe, in line with changing work responsibilities within the PASP Division.
